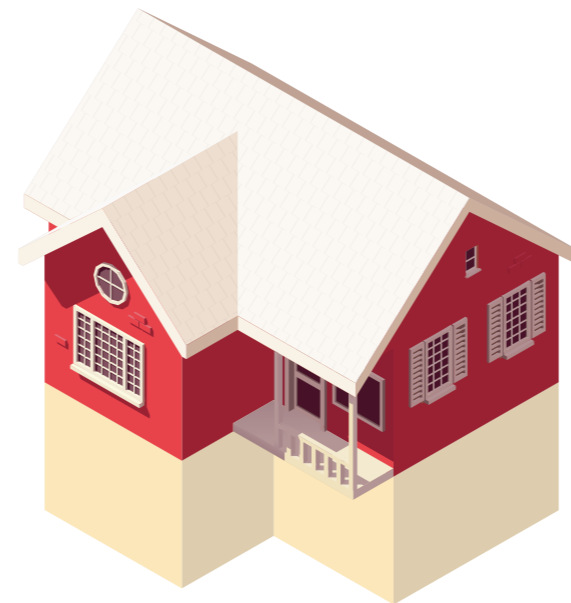
If told not to evacuate or it is too late to evacuate and you are in any of these structures below:

For all locations, **stay inside and minimize air flow** by turning off all furnaces, air conditions, fans, and heaters.

Shelter-in-Place for Chemical Hazard

For all locations, **stay inside and minimize air flow** by turning off all furnaces, air conditioners, fans, and heaters.

If possible, further reduce exposure to the chemical hazard by using duct tape and plastic sheeting to:

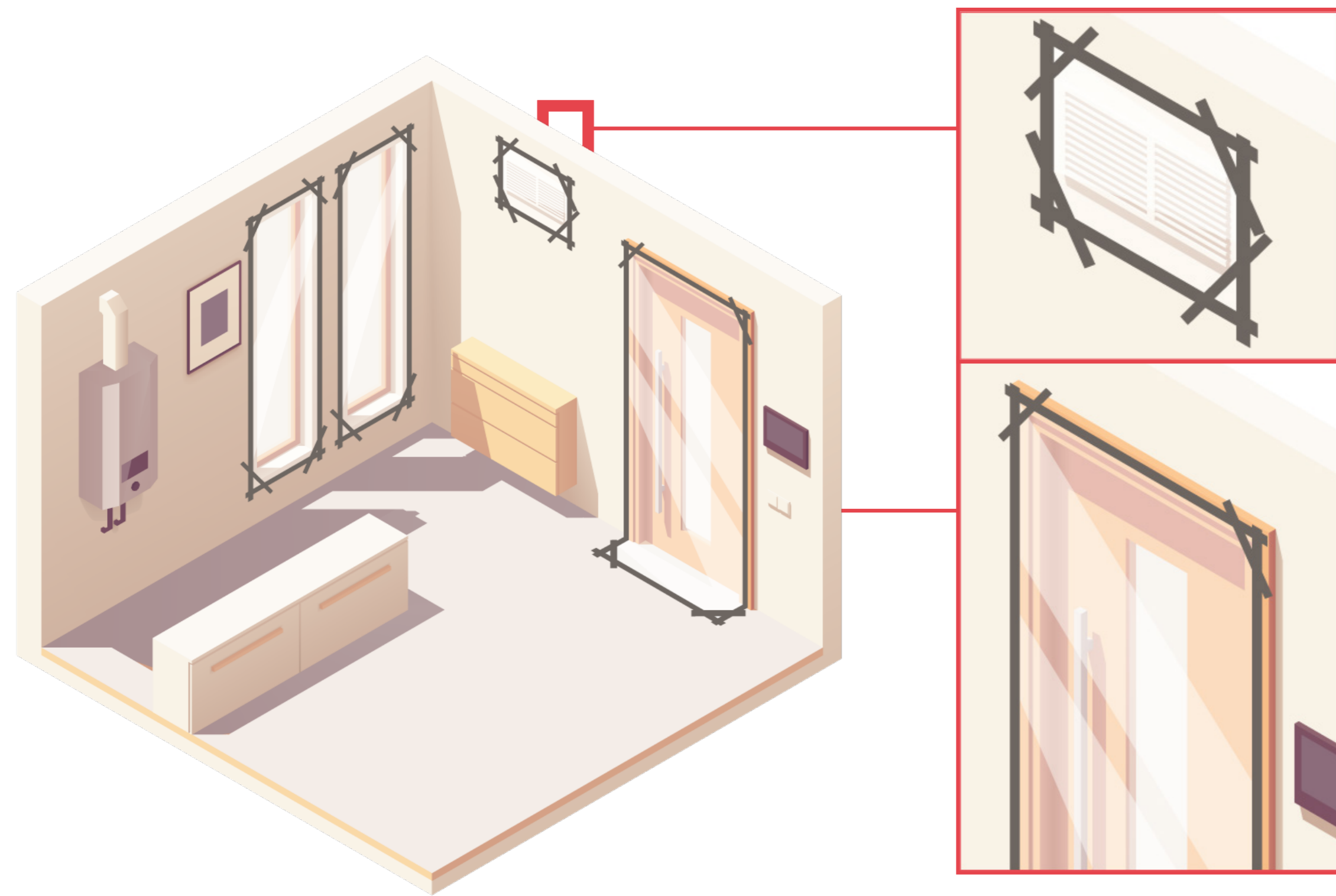
- tape the gaps around doors and windows
- cover any vents or recessed fans
- tape over electrical outlets

Going to an interior room without windows will make it easier to seal the room.

Shelter-in-Place for Chemical Hazard



- **Use duct tape and plastic sheeting to seal** around the windows and doors. This will reduce contaminated air coming into the room.

Turn off all fans,
heater or air
conditioner.





Shelter-in-Place for Chemical Hazard

Take Additional Safety Measures

Go inside as quickly as possible.
Bring any pets indoors.

Lock all doors and windows for a
better seal.

Turn off the air conditioner or
furnace, all fans, **close** the fireplace
damper and any other place that air
can come in from outside.

Use duct tape and plastic to seal
around doors and windows in the
room where you take shelter.

Listen for current emergency
information and instructions from
authorities.

Do not drink water from the tap.
Stored water will be safer.
