Key Messages

The Individual Assistance registration deadline of April 28 is fast approaching for West Virginians.

Raleigh County residents are now eligible to register for FEMA Individual Assistance. In addition, communities in Raleigh and Boone counties are now eligible for FEMA's Public Assistance. The PA program reimburses governments and certain nonprofits for expenses incurred from life-saving measures taken during the emergency, along with infrastructure repairs and other expenses.

Deadline to apply for Individual Assistance is **April 28, 2025.** When applying for FEMA assistance, residents should provide their 911 address as the location at the time of disaster to ensure accuracy in their application.

The quickest way to apply is online at <u>DisasterAssistance.gov</u> or downloading the FEMA App. You can also apply by calling **800-621-3362**.

Disaster Recovery Centers (DRCs) are open in **six counties** to help survivors apply for assistance, answer questions, and provide access to resources from other agencies. To find center locations go to <u>fema.gov/drc</u> or text "DRC" and a Zip Code to 43362.

- Individual Assistance-designated counties: Logan, McDowell, Mercer, Mingo, Raleigh, Wayne, and Wyoming
 - Individual Assistance deadline to apply: April 28, 2025
- Public Assistance-designated counties: Boone, Greenbrier, Lincoln, Logan,
 McDowell, Mercer, Mingo, Monroe, Raleigh, Summers, Wayne, and Wyoming
 - Request for Public Assistance (RPA) deadline is April 18, 2025. The RPA deadline for Raleigh and Boone counties will extend to May 1, 2025.

Disaster Recovery Centers

Disaster Recovery Centers are open in Logan, McDowell, Mercer, Mingo, Wayne and Wyoming counties. Locations can be found online at the <u>DRC Locator</u> or <u>www.fema.gov/disaster/4861</u>.

All centers are accessible to people with disabilities or access and functional needs and are equipped with assistive technology. Residents do **not** need to visit a center to apply for assistance. Impacted residents can <u>apply online</u>, at a <u>Disaster Recovery Center</u>, through the <u>FEMA App</u>, and by calling the FEMA helpline at 1-800-621-3362. FEMA does not distribute cash at Disaster Recovery Centers.

U.S. Small Business Administration

The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) offers low-interest disaster loans for homeowners, renters, businesses and nonprofit organizations to cover losses not fully compensated by insurance and other sources. Apply online at SBA.gov/disaster.
