## AIR OPERATIONS BRANCH DIRECTOR

<b>RESOURCE CATEGORY</b>	Incident Management
<b>RESOURCE KIND</b>	Personnel
<b>OVERALL FUNCTION</b>	The Air Operations Branch Director helps ensure the safe and efficient use of aviation resources.
<b>COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. This position can be ordered as a single resource or in conjunction with a National Incident Management System (NIMS) typed team (Incident Management Team).</li> <li>2. Discuss logistics for deploying this position, such as working conditions, length of deployment, security, lodging, transportation and meals, prior to deployment.</li> <li>3. Requestor specifies any additional qualifications necessary, based on incident complexity and needs.</li> </ol>

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

<b>DESCRIPTION</b>	<p>The Air Operations Branch Director:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Establishes or transitions into a branch under the Operations Section in the Incident Command System (ICS)</li> <li>2. Supervises and configures the branch with groups as necessary</li> <li>3. Maintains full operational control over incident-related air and support assets or coordinates the deployment of and support for Air Operations resources</li> <li>4. Assesses both manned and unmanned air resource needs and ensures the appropriate use of both under Air Operations</li> <li>5. Maintains accountability for all incident air assets</li> <li>6. Oversees mobilization and demobilization of air resources</li> <li>7. Ensures airspace safety and deconfliction by coordinating temporary flight restrictions (TFR) and flight routes</li> <li>8. Monitors all significant air resource problems and emergencies, and reports them to appropriate personnel</li> <li>9. Coordinates air resource needs and use with state and federal agency representatives</li> <li>10. Supports the Operations Section Chief or Incident Commander (IC) based on their requirements related to the Incident Action Plan (IAP)</li> </ol>	Not Specified

<b>TRAINING</b>	Completion of the following: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. IS-100: Introduction to the Incident Command System, ICS-100</li> <li>2. IS-200: Basic Incident Command System for Initial Response, ICS-200</li> <li>3. ICS-300: Intermediate Incident Command System for Expanding Incidents</li> <li>4. ICS-400: Advanced Incident Command System for Command and General Staff – Complex Incidents</li> <li>5. IS-700: National Incident Management System, An Introduction</li> <li>6. IS-800: National Response Framework, An Introduction</li> <li>7. E/G/L 0191: Emergency Operations Center/Incident Command System Interface</li> <li>8. Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ)-approved Air Support Group Supervisor course</li> <li>9. AHJ-approved Introduction to Air Operations course</li> </ol>	The NIMS Training Program defines a national baseline to guide and promote NIMS training. It provides recommendations to assist AHJs in developing their own training plans, tailored to their specific needs.
<b>EXPERIENCE</b>	Knowledge, Skills and Abilities: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Knowledge of air tactical operations</li> </ol> Experience: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Successful completion of the National Qualification System (NQS) Position Task Book (PTB) for the NIMS Air Operations Branch Director, or equivalent AHJ documentation</li> <li>2. Experience in an air operations support position</li> </ol>	Military rating (current or former) as a pilot or navigator may fulfill air tactical or air support experience requirement.
<b>PHYSICAL / MEDICAL FITNESS</b>	Light	The NIMS Guideline for the NQS defines Physical/Medical Fitness levels for NQS positions.
<b>CURRENCY</b>	Functions in this position or a higher position during a qualifying incident, planned event, exercise, drill or simulation at least once every three years	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Military experience may fulfill this currency requirement.</li> <li>2. A higher position is one for which this position is a prerequisite within the Operations Section.</li> </ol>
