COMPENSATION AND CLAIMS UNIT LEADER

RESOURCE CATEGORY	Incident Management
RESOURCE KIND	Personnel
OVERALL FUNCTION	The Compensation and Claims Unit Leader oversees unit staff responsible for financial concerns resulting from property damage, injuries or fatalities at the incident.
COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS	 This position can be ordered as a single resource. Discuss logistics for deploying this position, such as working conditions, length of deployment, security, lodging, transportation and meals, prior to deployment. Requestor specifies any additional qualifications necessary, based on incident complexity and needs.

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

DESCRIPTION	 The Compensation and Claims Unit Leader: Establishes or transitions into a unit under the Finance/Administration Section Configures unit with personnel to support incident needs, in consultation with the Finance/Administration Section Chief Reviews and coordinates procedures for handling compensation and claims Maintains cumulative incident compensation and claims documentation Coordinates status of accident and injury-related investigations Advises on the nature and status of all existing and potential claims Coordinates closely with the Medical Unit, Cost Unit and Safety Officer Coordinates with the Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ) to maintain documentation 	Not Specified
