SUBJECT: Nonprofit Security Grant Program - National Security Supplemental
Notice of Funding Opportunity

Today, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), a component of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), announced the availability of the Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for the Nonprofit Security Grant Program - National Security Supplemental (NSGP-NSS). The NOFO released today represents \$210 million in available federal assistance and may be found online at <http://www.fema.gov/grants> and at <http://www.grants.gov>.

The NSGP provides funding support for hardening and other physical security enhancements to nonprofit organizations that are at high risk of terrorist or other extremist attacks. Of the \$210 million provided by the NSGP-NSS, \$105 million is available to nonprofit organizations located within one of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI)-designated high-risk urban areas (NSGP-NSS-Urban Area or NSGP-NSS-UA). Additional, separate funding in the amount of \$105 million is also appropriated for nonprofit organizations located outside of the FY 2024 UASI-designated high-risk urban areas (NSGP-NSS-State or NSGP-NSS-S). As in previous fiscal years, the NSGP-NSS will be a competitive grant program.

Eligible applicants must apply for funding through the FEMA Grants Outcomes (FEMA GO) system portal at <http://go.fema.gov/>. The following forms or information are required to be submitted via FEMA GO. The Standard Forms (SF) are also available at <https://grants.gov/forms/forms-repository/sf-424-family>. The State Administrative Agency is the only eligible applicant for the NSGP-NSS, applying on behalf of nonprofit organizations within states and/or eligible high-risk urban areas.

Applicants are strongly encouraged to begin the application process as soon as possible, including obtaining a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) number. The UEI is a 12-character alphanumeric identification assigned to an entity by the System for Award Management (see SAM.gov). The UEI is required for applicants and may take up to four weeks to obtain. Instructions on how to request a UEI can be found at <https://sam.gov/content/entity-registration>.

To obtain the UEI, all applicants must register with SAM. Failure to register with SAM will prevent an applicant from completing the application in FEMA GO. **Applicants are strongly encouraged to begin their application in FEMA GO at the time of this announcement** to ensure they have adequate time to start and complete their submission. Completed applications must be submitted in FEMA GO no later than **5 p.m. Eastern Time (ET), on January 24, 2025**.

Only final submissions made through the FEMA GO system located at <http://go.fema.gov/> will be accepted. FEMA will evaluate, act on applications, and make awards no later than May 10, 2025.
